I highly recommend the first two (and the bridges), but this one just doesn't captivate as much.

Lack of growth in the writing aside, there is also no growth in the characters or any plot advancements that the first two didn't cover. A little bit of a let down. I thought "at least there is a final mini-story after this", but it was so riddled with spelling and grammar mistakes that it had me upset as well; although the story was a little better and THAT is what the author should have used as the story for Code instead of just another repeat of it's prequels.

I am a diehard fan of the Robin Hood Hacker. I have loved all the three books now and the short stories going with them.

It is why I am sorry I will only give three stars. Do not get me wrong, Carolyn McCray has still had plenty of tricks in her writing to make it entertaining. The book is well written and fun.

Plenty of action, plenty of funny moments in this one. Easy to read, not easy to put down. But I wished that Carolyn had had another idea to get the Robin Hood Hacker to the lair of the Hidden Hand, I do not know what, but maybe a hidden bomb somewhere or the abduction of new borns to inject them with something....well, anything that was not another pandemic.

In Code, The Hidden Hands release a disease to kill three quarters of the population, and the Robin Hood Hacker and her sidekick Quirk have to race against time to find the antidote.

So, when you read Code, you feel something of "deja vu" because it is what was used in Encrypted and Cipher. Twice, Ok, but three times, not for me.

Code can be read as a stand alone and I think that if you are a newbie in the series, then you will appreciate it. Carolyn McCray gives plenty of background details, so, there is no need to have read the others. It is better in fact.

I guess quite early who was helping Ronnie and Quirk but I was not prepared for what happened in the lab facility. I thought, Oh No, not now.... anyway, you have to read the book to find what happened.

In a nutshell, Code is a true Robin Hood Hacker's book. Over the top action, unbelievable technology and weaponry, humour, but also some Tender Love and Care.

The 3 stars is only because the plot was too repetitive. But if like me you love "crazy" action books then get Code. You will not regret it.
