It isn't the light, fluffy stuff many expect from a Scottish Highland romance. It isn't even the war torn romance that might encompass a more serious Scottish historical.

This story explores the horrible disease of alcoholism from the very unique, medieval perspective of the heroine rather than any male character - a twist in and of itself!
