This is a great book. For this reader I consider the angst very manageable. It was not overwhelming like so many authors produce these days where the torment and unhappiness is only complemented by a tiny sliver of togetherness, love and happiness. I was actually able to enjoy this story with a calmness that was relaxing. Was it angst-free? No, it was not but it was delivered in small doses and resolved in a very reasonable amount of time. Now, to meet our main characters. We have our ruling Prince, Stefan, of the tiny Mediterranean kingdom of Chantaine. As we learned in book one he is not the easiest of men to deal with. Beyond stubborn, he thinks he knows what's best for all his siblings. His parents have passed on and they were distant to their children as they were raised by nannies and staff. His father was a womanizer and kept his mistresses and illegitimate children away from the palace. Stephan actually wants to be a completely different type of man and ruler, one who does not cause scandal and rules his small country so it will prosper giving the residents of Chantaine the opportunity to earn a decent income. He also loves horses and has quite a large stable.

This is where our heroine, Eve Jackson, comes into play. Stefan met her when he visited his pregnant, unwed sister and her boyfriend in Texas. He met Eve who helped out with difficult horses as a repayment of a debt. Since that meeting Stefan has made her an offer to be the head of his stables at the castle in Chantaine. She has given it a lot of thought and at the beginning of this story she is still unsure whether she will accept but she finally does.

They both become very attracted to one another and soon they are embroiled in a secret affair. Secret because of his reputation but mostly hers. He knows the paparazzi and press will crucify her - tanking her good reputation as a person and a highly respected 'horse whisperer.'

Awhile into their affair Stefan is presented with some life-changing news and Eve remains by his side and has a big roll in helping with this unexpected situation.

I highly recommend this book as well as the entire so-worthy series.
