GOING HOME is a decently moving tale about a guy in a dysfunctional family who isn't really looking to change, though he needs to. I think the strength of the story is its pacing and its cause-and-effect sequence of events, helped along by scenes in a psychology classroom, that show how to move from a destructive mindset to a helpful one.

I did have issues with the writing at times, minor as they were, but I think that's more my own tastes than any fault of the book. It's very well put-together, more so than other indie productions I have tried to read.

Going Home is told from Jared's perspective and while I usually don't love a male narrator, it really worked for this story. I loved how there was more to Jared than meets the eye.
