Patty is a big strong bear shifter and has trouble finding guys who aren't intimidated by her strength...even other bear shifters. She's also a police officer, which only increases the intimidation factor. She's called out on a domestic violence case only to realize that the woman being abused is her little sister, who is extremely shy and submissive. The guy who called it in is an Argentinean jaguar shifter and ex-mercenary and seems to be perfectly fine with how strong and independent Patty is. And he's not intimidated at all...he's actually attracted. Together, they work to get the guys who are trying to kill Patty's sister and the abuser who got her involved in this mess. And Patty begins to wonder if she's found her mate - if only she could be sure that Mario would stick around.

This was a good story. I didn't love it, but I did enjoy it for the most part. Patty and Mario have a nice little romance going - he's interested in her from the get go and he's pretty sure right away that she's the one and he's sticking around to be with her. They actually mate pretty quickly. Patty is just so damn appreciative that he treats her like a lady despite her dominant nature. And the workings of the police and Mario's mercenary faction enhanced rather than overwhelmed the story. I did get a bit irritated at the constant (and I do mean constant) mention of how Patty is "dominant." She monologues about it all the time. And here's the thing - she's not really dominant in the sense that she likes to control or tell others what to do or even have others submit to her. She's "dominant" in the sense that she is a strong, independent woman who can defend herself and stand up to the other strong men around her. I'm not sure that makes her dominant. But I do like that the hero appreciated this about her nature and never sought to change it, even for the sake of his own macho pride.

I received this book as an ARC for an honest review.

In this book we meet Patty Montone and Mario Brandon. Patty is with the police force in Grayslake and her bear is on the lookout for its mate the problem she is having is most men find her to dominate. Patty wants a mate but isn't sure she will ever find someone who can deal with all of her. So when she goes on a call with Van (the local enforcer) and finds her sister the woman that she was needed for she is most focused on her but there is a part of her that takes notice of the guy who made the call. Mario is a man that she isn't sure what to make of but her bear knows what it wants and right now it wants him. However Patty wonders will he stick around when he finds out she is not a submissive bear willing to roll over for anyone.

Mario comes from a proud and powerful line of jaguar's. When she shies away from him he knows she needs more help than he can give and calls in the police little did he know that this shy woman would bring his mate right to his door. Mario can barely contain his cat as it tries to reach for his mate and mark her immediately but Mario knows she has strength that he needs to prove he can accept before she will let him mark her. However when more trouble comes and he has to tell her about his past can she accept him for who he is or will her strength and her job be a hindrance for their mating?

Mario is drawn to Grayslake by his intuition and finds his fated mate. This is definitely The Right Spot. I absolutely loved it.

I literally stumbled onto Bianca D'Arc three years ago, fell in love with her stories, I've bought and read over fifty of her books since then and I've got at least another two on pre-order. I've never been disappointed and can quite honestly say I'm addicted to her writing, but this is the first one I've written a review for. Like all her books, this one is well written in the third person, action packed, steamy, funny, was written and can easily be read as a stand alone and I absolutely loved it. It's also her first book in Celia Kyle's new 'Grayslake: More Than Mated' series for Kindle Worlds, another one of my favourite authors, and a series I've loved from the very first book and, fortunately for me, I'd already bought the first five before it became a KW series.

Mario Brandon, Jaguar shifter and world weary ex-mercenary is longing to settle down, he just needs to find the right spot and he's visiting an old friend in Georgia when his intuition pulls him towards the bear shifter town of Grayslake. Never one to ignore that side of his heritage, he follows the pull and on his very first day in his new rental home meets the woman his jaguar is sure is his fated one, his true mate. An Alpha bear, as dominant as he is, an equal he can spend his life with is exactly what he wants and he can't help his body's instant reaction to her. He needs to get to know her and the situation doesn't make it that easy, but where there's a will.....

Patricia Montone is an officer in the Grayslake Police Department and a dominant Alpha bear who scares the hell out of pretty much every male she knows, with the exception of the Abrams brothers, so her love life is pretty much non-existent. She'd love to find a mate who isn't afraid she's more dominant than him and she's about to get her wish, but the call-out she meets him at also involves finding her shy and submissive baby sister bloody and beaten by her boyfriend Greg. Not the most auspicious of starts, but both she and her bear really like the cat and would love to get to know him, except she needs to take care of her sister. She'd really like to take care of Greg too, but she trusts her Itan, Ty Abrams, to pass judgement and do the right thing.

I'd love to tell you all about this terrific story, and I could go on and on about how good it is, but I don't want to give spoilers and ruin it for anyone, so I'll just tell you that this is a fantastic paranormal romance, filled with action, steam, and humour with drug dealers and assassins to fight, a mercenary team I think I've met before in the Tales of Were, lots of wonderful characters including a housecat with the unlikely name of Mrs Snufflepuff, Aunt Suzy, Seth and so many more along with a happily ever after for Mario and Patty.
