I was hooked from the first chapter. A continuation of the Ty'lers of Texas series, takes you to the not to distant past of about 30 years ago and centers on the extended family of Bull Tyler. They return to reclaim what was taken from them and are running from a dangerous group of men. We are also introduced to a man who is fighting his own demons and has come to Texas to try to forget. We are also reintroduced to old enemies and their machinations to get what they've wanted for years. Texas Free takes you 12 years into the future life of Bull Tyler and a grown up Rose Landro.

Rose Landro is running for her life back to people that can protect her and keep her safe. She wants to reclaim the land that belonged to her deceased grandfather and was left to her. She's hoping to fly under the radar of the drug cartel who has taken over the town in Mexico she lived in. Bull knows he's got trouble when he sees Rose now 26 pull into his ranch. The old family enemy, the Prescotts, have started their efforts to get their hands on Rose's piece of land that Bull has basically stole from her to try and keep Rose safe. An undercover newly arrived to Texas Tanner McCade has been sent to look for missing cattle on the Prescott ranch. He's fighting his own memories of the past and sending money home to his brother to help on the family ranch. He sees Rose when she comes to stake a claim to the land that her grandfather left her. Tanner doesn't know if she is part of the rustling ring or an innocent bystander by decides to keep an eye on her. Meanwhile Bull isn't wanting to turn over the land and tries to explain his reasons to Rose. He calls about some missing cattle and is told about the undercover officer. Tanner is suspicious of Bull and his men because of what he's been told by Prescott and rumors. Prescott sends his son to extend an invitation to Rose.

She doesn't trust him but uses his lawyer to find out her options on getting her land back. Finally Bull relents and signs over the land. Tanner can't stay away from Rose and keeps an eye on her. She takes Bull's sons for a ride and they find Tanner shot and unconscious. Bull finds out what Prescott's ben up to makes a demand. After meeting Bull Tanner is less suspicious of him and begins to not trust Prescott. Tanner and Rose get closer and he keeps watch over her. They confide in each other about their pasts. Rose looks for a way to make money and is warned about raising her sheep. Old friends show up at Rose's house. Tanner and Rose go to Bull for help. They come up with a plan. Tanner and Rose become lovers. He leaves after solving the rustling on the Prescott ranch. He goes to help his brother only to think about Rose the whole while. Rose is doing the same in Texas. Tanner comes back and is offered a new position near where Rose lives. They decide to come back together and tell each other I love you. Rose is worried about her friends and wants to check on them. Tanner and Rose go to visit a remote ranch and get information that scares them. They contact Bull. Bull goes to check on the old friends hidden away and comes to the same conclusion as Rose and Tanner. Arriving home he realizes that his sons and housekeeper are missing. An exchange is offered and accepted with a ambush planned. Tanner is injured and makes a decision. Rose must make a life altering decision. A marriage takes place and a life in Montana is started. A baby is born with another on the way and Rose learns how to work on a ranch and fall in love with Montana.

Janet Dailey has always been a favorite author and continues to be with this book and series. I look forward to reading about the next generation of Tylers and what their lives will be like when Bull's sons grown up. Also I can see a new series with the children in the McCade family finding love and happiness in Montana. I look forward to the next book from Janet Dailey.

Rose had it hard. From a young age, she had to learn that the only person she could truly depend on was herself. After killing a man when she was just a teen, she was whisked to a place she had never been before with people she'd never met. They became her new family and she owed her life to Bull Tyler. Fast forward more than a decade and the couple who took her in have been murdered by the cartel that has taken over their town and they're out to get her too. After taking another man's life, she finds herself on the run and the only place she can think of to go, to be safe, is the only other home she's known... with Bull. She's determined to work the land that was left to her by her grandfather, but Bull has taken that land as his own. While trying to get her land back, she's also back to face the son of the man she killed, the mystery of missing cattle, and a stranger that works for the enemy that stirs something in her she's never felt before.

While there was much to enjoy with this story, it did drag in bits. Tanner was easy to like, but in the end I still didn't know him. Bits and pieces of his life were revealed, but it wasn't enough. However, his character was an honorable man, full of integrity, compassion and understanding and I loved how he was able to see to the heart of Rose. Now her character was the hardest to get attached to. She really was prickly. But I admired the heck out of this young woman. The author created a heroine that wasn't a stranger to hardship, who had survived against the odds, who had endured the unmentionable, and who literally demanded your respect.

Texas Free had doses of suspense and a bit of mystery, but at its core it was about hard work, family, finding hope, and falling in love.

Some times I feel like I get stuck in a reading rut and every other book is the same recycled plot, cliched scenarios and similar characters with different names. It's nice to pick up book and get a break from all that. Reading Texas Free was a nice break from that endless loop.

The story is a bit more cut and dry then I'm used too. This doesn't have any flowery romance and is low on heartwarming one liners between the MCs but I felt their connection and I wanted both Tanner and Rose to have their happily ever after in the end. In the long run, I guess this did delivery what it promised, two people finding love.

I'm not sure this would be a hit for everyone but I liked the change of pace (aside from the long winded descriptive scenery) this was a good read. Rose did really have the worst of luck and the treatment she received by the horrible men she encounters throughout the book was both dispicable and disheartening. I get it was different times (the story takes place in 1985) but it made me wonder if anything has really changed since then.

Quick Summary:

Rose has made it back to Texas, ready to claim the plot of land her grandfather died protecting. But she's been gone for 12 years and getting back her rightful inheritance is blocked by men convinced they know better.

She crosses paths with Tanner, an undercover agent working to catch some rustlers in the area. Tanner doesn't know if Rose is friend or foe, she's mysterious and tight lipped and just happened to return home at the same time cattle go missing.

With the cartel on her tail, a battle for her land ongoing with two sides pulling her in difference directions, Rose and Tanner manage to connect on a level neither one expected. Each one has scars and hurts that have kept them from moving on but when they come together, the future doesn't look so desolate.

Memorable Moments:

Most of the guys in Rose's life have left her, hurt her, lied to her, betrayed her or manipulated her but Jasper was the only one who ever treated her with any real affection. I loved this character and wish we would have gotten more of him in the story.

The part that sticks out for me the most it when things get a bit heated and he starts to pray. It made me laugh but it also was one of the sweetest moments in this book.

Would I recommend?

I liked the old time feel to it but I'm not sure this is something I would re-read again. The "I love you" scene was so lackluster that I felt a bit deflated after reading this all the way through with that being the reward. I also wasn't really feeling the loose ends that were Ferg and his slimy rodent of a son, Gern. I wish the epilogue would have mentioned what happened to them.
