The idea of star-crossed lovers is not a new literary concept and many of us have found ourselves fascinated by someone we know isn't good for us. Playing on the idea that we cannot help who we love and that many of us cannot help but see the best in people, Nadine Mutas has brought her readers into the world of witches and demons and those who walk in the shadows. In *Blood and Shadows*, which is a novella-length follow-up to *Blood, Pain, and Pleasure* (which I have not read), we meet a young woman who finds herself fascinated by someone she knows she cannot have; Anjali just happens to be a witch and the someone fascinating is a Shadow Demon named Thorne. There are secrets galore for both our hero and heroine and the only real reason that my rating is not higher is because they are predictable secrets and the resolution of the story seems very trite to me. I know that there is only so much an author can do in a novella-length book, but I think that this story would have benefitted from a slightly lengthier treatment so that we got the whole story.

There is some sex in the book, but it is not overly-explicit and, therefore, I recommend the novel to mature readers 16+ who enjoy paranormal romance about star-crossed lovers.
