I was a little bummed that it switched from Yew wanting simply to be awesome like Morgan to a more narrow focus on appearance; I appreciated the opening skewed more toward "Morgan is more awesome than me and I want to be like him" rather than "he's pretty and I want to be pretty," because a lot of books do the latter. But the illustrations are still fabulous and it still has the overall understanding of being who you are and not someone else. (This is something I still need to hear, even as an Adult.)
