I left with the idea I wanted space, but I returned with the idea I need Logan.

Before *Just One Night*, I hadn't read any of Jami Wagner's books. So I didn't really know what to expect. The only thing I could get a vibe of off is the cover. A cover I love. Especially because of the colors, but also because of the composition. *Just One Night* is the second novel in the *Black Alcove* series, but fortunately all books can be read as a standalone. And that's exactly what I did. *Just One Night* has all the ingredients for a sweet and perfect romance. Luckily, it's a multi-layered romance. It isn't solely about love between friends, but it's a tale about two friends who love each other very much. Two friends that both have their own insecurities. Deep-layered insecurities that make up for amazing background-stories. And those uncertainties may be destructive to their wish of a successful relationship. But that's not the only thing that is sabotaging their newfound and fragile relation. There is much, much more.

"Being with you scares me. I'm scared of the way I feel, how I think, the ideas I get. I think more of you than I do of my own future, and that terrifies me."

Sara Connelly is a controlfreak. The most important thing in her life (at least in the beginning of the book) is her will to be successful. And for her successful is having a fruitful career, by owning her own bar. She always had feeling for Logan, but those feeling scare her because she can't control them. That's also why she sees Logan as one of her biggest weaknesses.

I'll never get over the way she makes me feel. Like I'm important, proud, loved. She makes me want to be a better man.

Logan Parker has a whole other outlook on life. He lives his life day by day and he isn't at all scared of his feelings for Sara. He can't wait for them to be more than friends. All though just friends has always been difficult for the two of them. Logan is screwed in the head in a different way. He doesn't strive for control, but he just wants to be loved. That finally someone in his life would pick him. It's a result of being in a lot of foster families. His own parents and a couple foster families didn't want him. It has scarred him. He has the constant feeling he has to prove himself to other's. He thinks he needs to prove that he's good enough for Sara and he also thinks that Sara deserves better than him.

And the last thing that scares me, the thing that could ruin me, is committing to someone who will leave me with a broken heart. Committing to Logan Parker to be exact.

Sara and Logan have been best friends for a very long time. In high school, they even were a couple. Logan broke up with Sara, because he didn't want to have a girlfriend when he would start his new life at college. At least, that's what he tells her. There is a little more to it than that. But with breaking up, he didn't only break their relationship, he also broke Sara's heart and her trust. She developed some serious commitment issues. Yet, five years later Sara agrees to one night with him, when he confesses that the break-up was the biggest mistake he ever made. After their one night together, Sara's defense-mechanism kicks in and she runs. For a year, she's traveling around the world. When she gets back, she's sure of two things (or so she thinks): her career is still important to her, but so is Logan. When Sara and Logan are finally ready to make things official, her career comes in the way. And so does his career. Her father gives her the opportunity to own her own bar. There is just one teensy little problem: the bar is in Colorado, another state. Meanwhile, with Sara leaving, Logan gets his own chance of a lifetime at The Black Alcove.

We are Sara and Logan. We are the best when we are together, and we're made for each other.

This will give them the space and time to grow as a couple, while both growing individually in their careers. Their still vulnerable relation is tested in so many ways. Temptations in the form of other people. Secrets. They both keep a lot of secrets from each other. Other people's lies. Being busy with bar stuff. Distance. They don't get to see a lot of each other. Sara's dad, Dean. I really developed some serious hate feelings for Dean. To be honest, I'm still feeling them, even after finishing the book. He was playing some sick game and it's so obvious. Funny thing is, both Sara and Logan had their suspicions from the beginning, but ignored it. Thinking they were just seeing things, as did I. I'm not going to spoil it, so I'll just leave it at that. These tests cause Sara's and Logan's insecurities to come into play. Will they be successful in maintaining a long-distance commitment while in the early stages of their relationship?

Jami chose first person narrative and I like that best. It always makes me feel like the characters are personally telling the story to me. I also really liked the words and the construction of the sentences. They make the tale more appealing, captivating and pleasant to read.

For me, it doesn't matter whose place we pick, as long as I'm with Sara, I'm home.

Just One Night really charmed me. I loved reading about all the insecurities Logan and Sara had and how they survived it to make their relationship wonderful. I absolutely cherished how their friends tried their best

to help them. So I admired the love and the friendships. I genuinely want to read about Kelsey and Ethan's story now, which is described in the first book of the Black Alcove series. Whether they were a couple or not, it's always been Sara and Logan, from the time they became friends on Logan's first day of school to working together at the Black Alcove. When they decide to give having a relationship another shot, any plans they had are nixed when Sara's father informs her that he bought a bar in Colorado that would be exclusively hers. She's excited, both at the prospect of finally being in charge of a bar that was hers and at Logan taking over as manager of the Black Alcove. But it's pretty clear from the beginning that Sara's father had ulterior motives and Logan is smart enough to notice. They may only be a few hours away from one another, but distance is distance and it puts a strain on their still new relationship. When doubts and suspicions spring up, Logan and Sara may end up with another heartbreak.

She may be smart and driven and a heck of a bar manager, but Sara seemed to be absolutely clueless as to how to move forward with her relationship with Logan. She was either blind or naive to not know what her father was doing. I felt that Logan was trying to make more of an effort to stay connected to Sara and while Sara did love Logan, he fell behind in terms of her list of priorities. I did, however, end up liking Liam, who I wasn't a fan of for about half the book, but I'm hoping he gets his own happily-ever-after later on (although he's in a different bar). I'm also curious with regards to Logan's sister Alexis as well as Conner Brian, Kelsey's brother who happens to have a young son. While Logan and Sara's love story didn't meet all of my high expectations, it was still a pretty good, albeit frustrating, read. Just One Night gets 3.5 stars, rounded off to four stars. ♥
