Jed Walker is a man on a mission. The ex-CIA agent first appeared in James Phelan's suspense thriller, "The Spy". This fiction story chronicled his first encounter with the shadowy, terrorist group, The Zodiac. The forthright, American operative was out to prove himself and clear his name but also to ultimately make the world a safer place. "The Hunted" picks up where "The Spy" left off.

The year is now 2015, some four years after Army Seals from Team 6 killed Osama Bin Laden. Now they are being eliminated one by one and all signs seem to point to Zodiac. Walker sets out to find and protect one of the remaining Seals named, Charles Murphy. Walker has a hard job ahead of him as he also has to find out who is at the bottom of all this and to prevent anything more sinister from happening.

It's easy to see how author, James Phelan is a best-seller. He keeps the energy high in this suspense-filled novel (making it not unlike a Matthew Reilly creation). The use of military terminology throughout makes the proceedings feel very authentic. The reader will easily become enveloped by the intelligent plot and will be eager to find out just what happens next.

Phelan's writing is the perfect storm of swift pacing and gritty prose about some tough and hardened men dealing with dangerous situations. "The Hunted" builds to a big and satisfying climax. It will also have you questioning people's loyalties, their appetites for revenge and their overall motives and personality traits. In short, it's a fascinating, psychological thriller that is gripping, rough and resolute.

It's a seatbelt-strap-on ride! A civilian, ex-Air Force, ex-CIA, ex-Superman without superpowers, is a man on a mission to save the world from terrorists, while visiting one seedy bar at a time!

Fast paced with short chapters, full of military jargon and what I assume are facts. Plot is in three stages with lots of action generated by a guy who doesn't want to stand on the sidelines and see terrorists destroy the world.

However, the beginning was confusing as this is second in a series that I hadn't read. I did find Walker a bit too perfect at times. But the more the book went the humour kicked in as a great reprieve from the heaviness as the suspense climbed. At times Walker's dialogue is repetitive and lagging in that middle book sag, and his comments lack all forms of sugar-coating tact, 'I'm stopping terrorists without a badge or a gun - so can I borrow yours!'

The back-up characters add colour and uniqueness to this tale. Squeak a backwaters tough-gritty trailer-girl added humanity to the super strong female agents with great smart-arse comebacks. There's a cracked cousin shooting from a bathtub at whitegoods emitting conspiracy theories into chicken nuggets - yes, it's there. I had to read that part twice?!... Along with a little old Lady whose wind troubles are put in the same conversation of Fracking and earthquakes letting gas explode. They add realness to the rest.

It's fast paced, gritty, no-frills, action packed tale of a mega-cool one-man-show. And as Walker says about the many bars that are simple, seedy, real with character he likes... this book and Walker - I liked it!
