I really felt like this book wasn't edited as well as the first two and there were a number of typos and grammatical errors that made me wince. In addition I quickly got tired of every character using "gonna" and "wanna" instead of "going to" or "want to." It did fit in Alanna's speech pattern (though it was a bit overused), but having her father and other characters say the same grated on me.

For the story, like I said above, the first half or so I found dragged a bit. It was a little too Breaking Dawn-ish for me (and I like Breaking Dawn - it just felt very derivative). I also got tired of Alanna and Ray just talking about how much they felt they were bad people. I understand insecurities; I don't need to be bludgeoned with them as a reader. HOWEVER, once the action got moving I felt sucked back into the story. I appreciated (view spoiler)

What I liked:

-The action. The author is very good at writing compelling, suspenseful action scenes that keep you on the edge of your seat, wondering what will happen next.

-Quinten's development. Quinten becomes a man in this book. Emotionally and mentally, he just grows into the strong man that Alanna's needs.

-The final confrontation with Ilene. It was everything I wanted it to be. It was angry and heartbreaking and unexpected. I thought it might have been the most emotionally devastating part of the entire book. This author is really good at showing different kinds of emotions without going too overboard.

-Alanna's transformation. She started out as a carefree young woman, and she ended up a fierce, slightly damaged woman fighting for the lives of her children. One thing I loved was the parallel between Alanna and Roger. She ends up permanently scarred and she wonders if she would ever become like Roger. There was a lot of contemplation for their futures.

-Soul mates. There was more of an explanation as to how the whole soul mate thing works, and the different types of soul mates there were. I liked how the definition of "soul mate" kind of changed into something more in all three books.

-The epilogue. It didn't go too much into detail by explaining what happened to every single surviving character since the final battle, but it did show that there was still plenty of happiness to be had. It wasn't too perfect, and it certainly wasn't a fairytale ending, but it was nice.

What I disliked:

-The babies. After they were born, there wasn't any information given on them other than their sexes and their names. I wasn't expecting a fully detailed breakdown of their abilities, but something would have been nice.

-Character death. One of the characters that played a part in the second and third books is killed, and Alanna doesn't get any real closure from it. She's not there when the death happens, and not a lot of time is devoted to dealing with it.

-There were a few really minor characters that I felt like were introduced solely to kill off and create extra drama, but there were also some more major deaths that made up for that.

Overall, this was a satisfying end to the series, and I was happy with it. I think the first book may have been my favorite, but this one was great too. I would definitely recommend this series to a friend. **4.5**
