My only negativity is the pace of the story. There are some parts where she goes into too much detail and I thought it should've been cut short. There were other parts where she speeds up the story and I would've preferred if she slowed down a bit.

Their dialogue isn't always realistic, especially in mundane conversations, and does go overboard on the lovey-dovey chat - but that might just be my preference!
