Lawman Nate is the one Chloe's in love with, but she's convinced he'll return to his big city cop job when his shoulder is healed; they keep giving each other mixed signals. Dalton is his deputy and the man who has been trying to convince EV to take a chance on him.

In this book, the town is being mystified by set aside items going missing, a Bigfoot sighting (drawing Sasq-Watchers), and the continuing mystery of who exactly is trying to ruin Ponderosa Pines.
