4. Writing Trait: The Prince and the Pauper includes many writing traits:
  - a. Ideas: The story includes key points (a message or a meaning) and has a positive impact on the reader.
  - b. Organization: The story hooks the reader, has a purpose and a logical structure, implements clear transitions and has a satisfying conclusion.
  - c. Voice: The voice of the story is entertaining; it includes age appropriate language (although a few words may need to be defined).
  - d. Conventions: Accurate sentences, paragraphs, spelling and punctuation are used throughout the story.
5. Usage for Classroom Instruction: This book could be read aloud in a lower level elementary school classroom (K-3). I would use this book for classroom instruction to teach about conventions because this book is a little longer and contains all of the necessary elements of conventions (spelling words consistently, accurate paragraphs, effective punctuation, correct capitalizations and proper grammar usage). The book is easy to read and the sentences are clear. Additionally, I could teach young children about the negative effects of greed and the positive effects of doing the right thing (the messages portrayed in the story). It is a simple and enjoyable story that teaches a powerful lesson that I could discuss with the children. The book also has vocabulary such as prince, king, castle, army, armor, kingdom, and dungeon that could be practiced and studied (dependent on grade level).
