Starts off with a prologue about a vision. The main character is Ajay Samuels and he is a guardian sorcerer. Their kind also has pale skin. Ajay's best friend is Zaniel Richards, also aka. as Consor(like training partner.)Consors either become best friends or soul mates if they are opposite gender.Zaniel is a arrogant person,not patient, and loves to train.
