I think it's fair to say that Madison and Logan have an intense connection. I had no doubt that Kolee would deliver when it came to the intimate, blush-worthy sex scenes. You can skip the sex scenes and dirty talk (as I did in parts) and still walk away knowing that Madison and Logan's chemistry will always be electrifying and hot as a thousand suns. However, this book isn't only about lust, at least that's what I thought until I kept reading.

My issue was my inability to empathize for the character's frustration, sadness and most especially the choices (mistakes) they make. I felt that Kolee didn't create a solid foundation for the protagonist's relationship prior to Chicago. Since there was no backstory, as time went on, the character development of Madison and Logan took a nose dive as the story unfolded, leaving me more convinced that these two will do each other more harm than good.

Giving Madison and Logan a foundation instills us with the understanding we need to keep rooting for them despite their internal conflicts, selfishness and lack of self control. I understand that their bad decisions doesn't make them bad people (just hormonal, conflicted idiots) but without a supporting backstory in addition to an unstable present, characters with no remorse is exactly what they came off to be. Chapter after chapter of tug of war created for a rather predictable and impatient read since neither of the characters changed in the process.

In the end, I hoped that Madison would've been strong enough to accept that they just aren't meant to be. Not only is it a more believable outcome, but it would've showed change (maturity), opening up the possibility that there is a chance for a real future between them.

STORY BRIEF: While Madison and Logan are "just friends". Circumstances occur where it is revealed that their friendship is only a charade, but a real relationship seems out the question. When the choice is being true to your feelings or holding on to the past, it seems to Madison that neither choice comes without pain or regret.

MY THOUGHTS: I wanted to enjoy this book- I really enjoyed 'Fated' by the same author, and was naturally looking forward to this one.

However, the characters turned out to be more dislikable than likable, with both the hero and heroine making choices to preserve their pride, then turning around and regretting them without thinking deeply about the consequences in the first place. At that point, their other choices just made it worse, going from rash, to ethically and morally questionable, to downright cruel.
