I really enjoyed book one and was excited to start book two, **Zombie King**. Once again, the reader is in the first -person narrative of Lexi. This is great, except we know stuff she has forgotten, so it can be confusing when incidents happen afterward and we, the readers, must keep track of what we know that Lexi doesn't.

This narrative also takes out some of the suspense. While I liked the story, there wasn't substantial character development-- which is not to say there wasn't more of the back-and-forth romance attempts between Lexi and Reece. Again, I was disappointed the writer chose to make their liaison 'forced' circumstances rather than letting them resolve some of their issues. This may be the last book for me. I over-looked the reluctant sex scenes in book one, but if book two indicates a trend, I'm not willing to stick with the series.

Now an official member of the team, Lexi has a few new skills to learn, unfortunately for her Reece is going to be one of her trainers. While the pair is still doing their best to ignore what happened between them, fate it seems has other ideas when a new threat rises that requires the squads attention.

I'm going to get my only real negative comment about *Zombie King* out of the way before we begin and that is that the start is a little too repetitive for me. I understand that sometimes important facts need to be reiterated when we follow a series through but you shouldn't need to summarise the entire plot so far. The recap was a little too lengthy for me and seemed unnecessarily thorough. I was there. I read book one. I don't need a play by play to remember what I just read.

With that out of the way I can concentrate on what I did like about the book and the fact that the second book was easier to get into; like with most series, we already know a bit about the characters and the world they live in so it's a little like coming home when the story continues. As the book goes on we learn a little more about Lexi and her mysterious bite mark. Lexi's age shows in the way she approaches the bond with Reece and while it's frustrating (for me at least because I want them to talk it out) it's understandable that the quiet, loner might not be comfortable confronting her crush. Lexi and Reece don't have an easy romance but then I guess things would be a little dull if they managed to work everything out in book two now wouldn't it. In some ways it's kind of sweet watching as Lexi bonds with the squad and begins to understand what it means to have real friends. Kala is her usual loveable self and it's clear to see that the girls have a true connection with one another. Flynn, while quieter and a little more reserved, also seems to be protective of Lexi but their friendship is much more understated. Surprising us and the team, Flynn also proves himself to be a bit of a strategist and has the uncanny ability to be able to get into the mind of their target and guess what they're next move might be. Reece is as standoffish as always but the bond is starting to play a little on his protective nature; much to Lexi's annoyance. Hands down, though my favourite scene is one that revolves around Reece and Lexi, as she comes to his rescue in the graveyard in a most unique and shocking way. Their bond isn't like anything I've read about before, so I'm looking forward to seeing how it progresses as the series continues.
