This is a two-book anthology, making it a good long read and showcasing Anne Rice's talents in two different genres -- supernatural fantasy and historical fiction. I enjoyed them both; she is a gifted natural storyteller and I have eclectic tastes.

The *Servant of the Bones* is a good page-turning story of a beautiful young man in Ancient Babylon who by traumatic magic is rendered immortal with superhuman powers. Over the centuries he is trapped in obedience to human masters as a genie, but breaks free and starts to use his powers for good, regaining his soul. An exciting and satisfying moral tale with Anne Rice's trademark empathy for eldritch creatures and high-octane imaginative powers.

The second is a long but engaging story of the 'gens de couleur libre' in antebellum New Orleans; a rich and eventually heartrending tale with characters so well drawn they feel as real to me as people I know, inhabiting a detailed and utterly convincing world of black slaves, white plantation owners, poor American-Irish whites and the free but disenfranchised society of people of mixed heritage. Even the words - mulatto, quadroon - give a slight shock of a completely alien world, exotic, alluring, at times cruel but with all the realistic moral ambiguities of injustice in an interdependent society. Excellent.
