I'm a fan of LCO and have read most of her books. This one was a slow start for me and at 10% it was a struggle. I wasn't engaged which surprised me as I have liked a number of her stories. For whatever reason, I never felt fully vested in either Cam or Will even though I had been looking forward to their story. (The characters were featured in the prior book in the series.) I have to admit that Barney, Cam's dog, was actually one of my favorite characters.

I liked the plot that LCO developed in the book and I did like how a thread from the past was resolved.

We all have preferences and pet peeves and unfortunately for me one of my pet peeves kept appearing in various forms throughout the book. I used to never see this, but lately it seems to be creeping into novels. The phrase "Will had..." was being replaced with "Will'd...". I really don't like contractions with people's names. Will Hawbaker is chief of police in Sweetwater, South Carolina. He meets up with an old classmate, Camellia Abernathy, where a body has been discovered. Camellia has had a major crush on Will since they were in school and since she is recently widowed, she thinks of Will all the time. Although Will regrets not hooking up with Cam back then, he is hesitant to renew the friendship because he played a part in the demise of her cheating, dishonest husband. However Will and Cam keep getting thrown together, causing both of them to let down their guards and begin a relationship. It turns out that there are several cases of deaths/suicides, including the body they found that may be the work of a serial killer. Will is afraid for Cam but all he has to go on is a lot of coincidences and a gut feeling. Will and FBI agent, Jesse Wellington continue to search for the truth, not only because they need/want to solve the case, but each has their own personal reason to want to find out the truth. When I love the way an author writes, I will devour all books by that writer and eagerly anticipate the new ones, auto-buying every time. Lisa Clark O'Neill is such an author - her books are always well-written, full of well-drawn characters and witty dialogue. Her third book in the Sweetwater Trilogy is not exception - I read it in one sitting!

Chief of Police Will Hawbaker was introduced early on in the series and was a character you were immediately drawn to. His family was one of the original reigning families of Sweetwater, but had taken a number of blows to its legacy over the years. Camillia Abernathy, who grew up in Sweetwater but married and lived in Savannah, found herself part of Will's investigation in the prior book, *Admit One*. The outcome of that investigation has changed the life of Cam and her young son and back to Sweetwater they come. Will cannot forget (nor forgive) how his investigation turned Cam's life upside-down; he is drawn to her and her son. However, Will also cannot forget how a recent investigation and murder in Sweetwater turned out....especially when he discovers that case is far from over. As Cam finds herself a witness to a discovery which blows that investigation open, Will finds himself falling for the curly-haired beauty.

If I have any complaint with this book, I felt it needed to be a bit longer. I would have liked more of an exploration of Cam's paintings. I also thought the end was a bit too neat and quick, and I am not sure the antagonist/villain was quite how I pictured him/her, in light of the crimes. However, a beloved character from Ms. O'Neill's Southern Comfort series made an appearance (*squeal* Jesse Wellington!) so I cannot knock a full star off the review for those couple of transgressions.

Although I mention the prior book, this book can stand alone. However, you will want to read the whole trilogy! And I highly recommend the Southern Comfort Series as well!
