My Thoughts: It isn't made obvious prior to this, but we end up with some background on Adrian at the start of this book and his family is Russian. What kind of Russian last name is Montez? There were some editing problems with this book, which surprised me because the first were so clean. This is one of many issues Graylee Perez has to face in Nikki Jefford's spectacular conclusion to her Spellbound trilogy, "Enchantment."

Graylee had it rough during the first two books. She died, then had to share a body with her annoying twin sister, then her soul got purged, and she ended up in yet another body.

When "Enchantment" starts, Gray is in Barcelona, staying at a retreat for young people who want a break from doing magic. Gray loves Barcelona--with its historic sites, amazing food, rich culture, and exciting nightlife. She makes some good friends, falls for a suave Barcelonan, who turns out to be a total *hijo de puta*, and to her shock and horror, runs into the absolute last carbon-based life-form on Earth she wants to see.

"Enchantment" has so, so many amazing plot twists, inspiring (and, in one case, vaguely creepy) character transformations, and at its very core, there is a sweet romance.

There are also so many potential spoilers, that I'm limited by what I can say.

Damn it! Because this book rocked.

The Spellbound Trilogy started off strong with "Entangled." I thought there were some growing pains in book two, "Duplicity." With "Enchantment," we visit Barcelona and Paris, taking in the sites with Gray. We see different hearts broken and repaired, love found and lost, complex spellwork, and a powerful finish.
