Parece que es relativamente habitual recopilar en el mismo volumen "El parásito" y "El Vampiro de Sussex", cosa que no entiendo totalmente. Es cierto que muy remotamente se pueden asociar al tema del vampirismo, pero ni así de forma general coinciden demasiado.

-El parasito (****): Al parece se publicó originalmente como "Novelette", un relato largo (o novela corta, supongo), que en la práctica se lee casi como un relato corto normal y corriente.

Mas allá de Holmes y algunas historias de aventuras, Doyle es una figura conflictiva para mi. Toda su última etapa me resulta bastante irritante (Lo de El país de las Brunas fue un horror). El parasito fue publicado antes de El perro de los Baskerville y El mundo perdido, así que todavía no había caído completamente en las garras del ocultismo.

La historia es la de un científico que se somete a sesiones de hipnotismo de manera experimental, por parte de una mujer que empieza a tener cierto control sobre él. Capitaliza en las modas ocultistas de la época, formando una historia muy tensa y que se lee muy rápido.

El siniestro personaje de Penelosa es francamente memorable. Y la narración a base de entradas de diario esta muy bien empleada a nivel de ritmo, adquiriendo una cadencia bastante frenética hacia el final. La conclusión, aunque algo abrupta (intencionadamente), me ha gustado bastante. Cierra la historia con un tono muy interesante.

Probablemente lo único negativo que puedo decir de él, es que tiene ciertos toques melodramáticos góticos algo exagerados, sobre todo en lo que respecta a la historia de amor con la prometida del protagonista (personaje bastante poco aprovechado).

-El vampiro de sussex (***): No es uno de los Holmes que mas me gustan. La idea de ver a Holmes enfrentado a un caso de vampirismo es sumamente atractiva, pero siempre me ha dado la sensación de que el relato es algo decepcionante. Es bastante simple, las pistas que usa Holmes son bastante discutibles, y la conclusión final queda algo forzada.

Ha pasado a la historia por la referencia que Holmes hace a "La rata gigante de Sumatra", que tantos otros autores han reutilizado. La prosa de Doyle es ágil y entretenida.
