The primary paranormal focus is on Lycans, which are not to be confused with werewolves because those are in this story as well, but are actually the mortal enemy of the Lycans. This Lycan world is aggressive and intense and Ms. Mitchell clearly put a lot of thought into how she wanted it to be portrayed. Brilliantly well done!

The secondary characters provide extra entertainment with their colorful personalities and the surprise twists in the plotline leaves me craving more. This book crossed that magical line between offensively bad and entertainingly bad. The problem with the story is that nothing of any real interest occurs. My Kindle showed that I was at 72% and it dawned on me that nothing significant had happened. I finished the book, and yep, nothing had really happened.

Problems with the book:

1. Her writing on a technical level. Lots of really short sentences that say nothing. Poor transitions from one scene to the next(One paragraph, you're here, then BAM, you're somewhere else with no transition from A to B) Choppy, cringe worthy prose. Bad metaphors, cliches galore. She was also trying way too hard to be dramatic, you could tell.
2. Phony dialogue. The dialogue sounds so flat and scripted. Not to mention. . .no one uses contractions(no don'ts, can'ts, shouldn'ts, etc) Yes, yes, I've read her little explanation for this, but sorry, when people read this, they're not going to think, "Man, her dialogue is authentic! They talk like rich southerners!" No, they'll be thinking, "Come on, who talks like this?"
3. Lifeless characters. No one was interesting, including the main character.
4. Story angles that were presented, then mysteriously dropped and never mentioned again.
5. Look, I realize this book is paranormal fiction, but the reactions the main character had to things going on around her were very unrealistic. She just went with the flow about everything("Oh, Dad was a Lycan, so I'm

one too? Ok.") She had no expressions of skepticism, anger, fear, doubt. . .nothing, she just accepted everything without question. Come on.
