I picked up this book hoping to get my usual dose of giggling and swooning over a cute love story between the boss and his employee, but this book offered A WHOLE LOT MORE. Not complaining, though.

Crossing Hathaway, Jocelyn Adams' first book I've read, is **NOT YOUR TYPICAL ROMANCE NOVEL.**

This story is about two flawed characters. **Evangeline "I dont date" Ross** is an adopted child who has issues with her father. She is witty, snarky, and she's blunt. **Benjamin Hathaway**, her employer, is a stuck-up prick who shuts off everyone who literally just lives in his office and doesn't go out because of his phobia. Somewhere down the road, they begin to like each other because Eva is the only one who can get Ben to open up.

Enter Ben's twin brother, **Richard** who at first, keeps flirting with Eva, so I thought to myself: Is this gonna be a love triangle?...NOT! You see, this guy's an ASS! Every scene where he's in it, I was like:

I'm sorry I'm afraid I couldn't finish this book...

It felt so jumpy and illogical, the characters were extremely overly dramatic and their connection therefore not extremely believable. The fact that they feel such a strong connection to each other in a matter of four encounters made it even less believable and I honestly could not connect or enjoy it. I realize that no romance novels are "real" but with the right progression you could easily fall into that addictive and euphoric place that happens when somewhere in your heart and mind you believe these characters exist and that connections like these might actually happen. That's the place I yearn for when picking up a romance novel and although there was a lot of potential for this book to be that, Ms. Adams' quick and extreme jumps in reactions made me disconnect.

For example, Eva's relationships with her coworkers: does she like Cameron as a person or not? she describes him in such a negative way in the beginning and a distancing way, but a few chapters later he can read her like an open-book and he teases her as if they're great friends, and I was left wondering..."when did this happen?". It's the same with the main characters, it felt like one or two chapters created a history of several months rather than several hours. He didn't really treat her so horribly for more than a day (and honestly I've had bosses who've done much worse than have me run for coffee in the rain - like seriously humiliatingly worse).

So, I wish I did like it, I liked the idea of it very much. And, I also want to thank Ms. Adams for writing it, even though it wasn't my cup of tea, I can't imagine it is easy to be a writer and I appreciate her putting herself out there like that. Thank you.
