Feldman is as descriptive as ever in all the right places. Of Will the groundskeeper we're told, "He's lean and muscular with spindly veins, popping out over defined muscles, running the length of his arms. A muss of dirty blond curls covers part of his face. What I can see of it is a sharply squared jaw, unshaven scruff and piercing blue eyes. He is handsome in a rugged sort of way that is part Marlboro man, part hippie. I am not sure if I am attracted to, or repelled, by him." Feldman also does a great job of showing versus telling. This book is much lighter in tone than her other, with refreshingly quirky characters set in a dark world. This is a serial killer unlike any I've read before and I can see this one up on the big screen with two thumbs up.

Sweet Things is comparable to "Alex Cross" or "Veronica Mars" in tone whereas "Cuts Like Glass" is more in line with "Gone Girl" with it's darker feel. Sweet Things Dying is about as good as it gets and highly recommended.
