I was lucky enough to get an advanced copy of this, and now I have a long wait until I can talk about this with folks come July. That, however, was the only downside of this book. Despite its length, WANDERERS is light on its feet, deftly spinning narrative plates without ever letting them wobble. As the story's events cascade farther and farther out of control, Wendig's laser focus on his characters keep everything feeling structured and affecting.

This book was heartbreaking, and funny, and clearly the product of Wendig wrestling with a lot of big ideas about the state of today's America. He explores darkness, and witnesses that darkness, and tries his best to understand that darkness. But the mark of Wendig's skill here, in my opinion, is that he never stoops to revel in it.
