Six years later, Tucker is a handsome, successful lawyer who (thank God) has matured a great deal. However, he feels an emptiness inside that threatens to consume him from never having known his son. He knows Rebecca has remarried; and although he has never stopped loving her, he decides to suck it up and get in touch with her in the hopes that he and Sammy can meet and maybe have some type of father-son relationship. This is where the book begins..

It has been my discovery that whenever a small child is directly involved & crucial to the plot of a Harlequin, it is going to be a major tear-jerker. Days Gone By is no exception. Sammy's vulnerability and timid countenance are very realistic - his little heart yearns to love this man that has suddenly appeared in his life, but, just like in real life, an older boy who comes from a broken home is Sammy's "mentor".

Tucker wants Rebecca back in his life as well as Sammy and the entire story is devoted to Tucker proving that he is worthy of having both of them.

I thought this was a great "second chance" love story and would have rated it higher but too much of the story was portrayed through internal thoughts so there wasn't enough dialogue. But it was the perfect "one-sitting" read I was looking for to pass the time on a dark, rainy afternoon.

When I read the Dangerous Spies series by this author I remember wanting to read this book long ago and then I just forgot about it. I am glad that booge brought this one to my notice once again. This was one emotion-laden angsty read. Our hero hasn't seen his son in six years although his former mother-in-law always sends him photos. When he sees his son's latest birthday photos he sees a sadness he finds echoing within his heart and wants to help ease it and with that maybe the emptiness he feels. He then calls his ex-wife Rebecca. For Rebecca his call opens all her past hurts.

The hero/heroine met when the heroine was 20 and the hero a lawyer was hired at her dad's firm. The heroine was painfully shy and had always been in love with and expected to have a life with her childhood neighbour Brian. But Tucker, the hero made her feel things she hadn't before and they ended up married. However, their marriage soon went sour because of various reasons, they were too young, the hero never opened up about his past with her, how he was caught in the middle of his parents acrimonious divorce and when she ended up pregnant he wasn't happy. In the middle of their troubles returned Brian which played on his insecurities as a husband and father. The hero felt that the heroine and his son would be happier with Brian so he walked away. To make sure the heroine made a clean break he even set himself up to be caught betraying her. (view spoiler)

Despite missing his son the hero always thought that the heroine was happy and married to the man she always loved but when he comes back to form a bond with his son he discovers differently. Rebecca has

spent the past six years putting off marrying Brian. In their time apart both the h/H changed, the heroine becoming more confident and the hero discovering what is important in life. It was so poignant seeing him around his son, his fear, his tentativeness. I felt the book did such a great job of showing us how different these two were six years ago and how the hero had changed and missed his family. Once Tucker comes back into her life Rebecca does what she has known for a long while in her heart, she has to set Brian free because although she loved him he never once made her feel like Tucker.

I felt the blame of their failed marriage lay on both of them. The heroine never let go of her emotional connection to Brian which made Tucker who was already scared of marriage (and her unhappiness) think that maybe Brian was a better choice for her. I loved how Tucker fought for his son and for Rebecca, trying to show her how he had changed and was deserving of her trust and love. He bares himself and his vulnerabilities to her proving his love. I truly believed in the HEA of these two.
