I received this book through Goodreads' First reads program.

Host of the Armageddon is a paranormal thriller set in the Middle East as a quasi-religious paramilitary group attempts to stop the coming of the four horsemen of the apocalypse. The story presents an interesting take on the four horsemen and is told fairly well, though towards the end it feels like the author had a difficult time resolving the book's primary conflict.

The book moves quickly, with a pace similar to many modern military thrillers. With the exception of the resolution and some minor issues in the early chapters, the story was entertaining and well written. At times it could have used some depth, but it was a fun read.

This could be good for mature young-adult readers, if they can handle some language, religious themes, and violence (including some graphic depictions of death and dismemberment). Regarding the religious themes, it should be noted that the treatment is not strictly biblical, so those easily offended by someone taking literary license with the biblical apocalypse may want to move along.

I look forward to reading the future installments in the series, with some hope that the characters show some growth as they are given more room to breathe.

Wasn't bad, especially for another free book courtesy of Barnes and Noble. I don't believe that this was an Indie writer, although to be honest it was about on par with most of them. The characters were a little underdeveloped for my liking but as far as a quick and dirty action book goes it wasn't bad. I have to shelve this as Urban Fantasy because I think that it's about the only genre that it falls under on my Goodreads shelves.

Basically, the short version of the plot is that the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse are real and that four thousand years ago Famine was slain in it's corporeal form and banished to exist as a spirit. Every so often it finds a host and this Illuminati-esque group of watchers kills the host before it can completely take over the body. The other three horsemen are weakened without their brother and so while they can cause a lot of chaos, they can't really cause an apocalypse scale event. Crazy antics ensue and people try to at turns save/kill Famine's new host before she completely succumbs.

This is worth reading for sure if you scored it for free the way that I did or if you can borrow it from someone but I personally wouldn't advise anyone to pay money for this one. Read it for free and then if you REALLY liked it you can pay for the other ones in the series. There are better books to spend hard earned money on.
