This book gives a lot of good practical examples and methods on how to use Number Talks in your classroom. I found it very relevant, and not "dry" as a teacher resource. My only quibble is that the set up for learning is done in a way that is not in line with my region (we do more Reggio-style learning with learning through play, than a single structured "math" time including Calendar, etc).
