It took less than 30 pages for me to love this novel and want to get my hands on the next two installments.

First of all, there isn't really any negative to say about this book. It's main weakness is its length and format (it cuts off in such a way that this feels like a serialization where all the books could be glued together and function as a singular book), but in terms of content and writing, I find nothing lacking.

The biggest strengths of the book lie in its characters. Wren and Reece are fantastically written and the dual POVs allow us ample time to get to know them both. We see their struggles, their feelings, their thoughts, the two sides of the story they occupy and how their lives intersect. I loved reading about them; Reece is especially dynamic as we watch his internal turmoil unfold and how he reconciles with it all. Wren is a good character, selfless and kind even when it's her life on the line, but she's so emotional that she doesn't always make the best choices and ends up with a lot of regrets. I think she'll have more time to grow in the next two books though, because as the book progressed she became more disillusioned. We also only get a nice set up to romance; it's a slow progression that feels natural and realistic, rather than this being love at first sight. By the end, Reece and Wren are only just starting to form a connection, there isn't any mentions of love, just sort of general feelings of mild caring. Feels very humane, very realistic.

Overall, I loved this book and after I'm done with this review I'll be buying the next two books. It sort of walks the line between casual and deep, with some elements being straightforward enough that it can be enjoyed as a story without much commitment, while other pieces are truly deep in nature and can invoke the reader to question their own stance on these issues, what would they think if they lived in this universe, what would they do in the characters' places, etc.
