The Nightlife London by Travis Luedke. Of vampires, fallen angels, werewolves, nightlife and...love? What is love? When thinking about writing the review for Mr Luedke's novel (the fourth on the series of the Nightlife, following on from New York, Las Vegas and Paris) I came to the conclusion that most fictional novels are about love, in one way or another. Of course romantic novels make love their central theme, but other genres and even literary fiction orbit around love. Be it family love, love for art, love of animals, love for nature and the world, love of travelling, love of power and success, love of money, love of beauty, love of justice, love of revenge, love of God, love of science, love of philosophy, love of sex...I won't push it further and say that even non-fiction is about love (although be it love of information, of exploring one's life or that of others, or passion for a particular hobby or skill form the basis of a fair amount of other types of books) but I think you get my gist.

'The Nightlife London' is an urban paranormal novel with plenty of action, excitement, dangers, seedy locations, Afghan and Colombian gangs, criminals, prostitution, drugs, blood, sex...and vampires, werewolves, fallen angels, all within our contemporary world, but not as we know it. Mr Luedke has woven a net of complicated relationships, rewriting the folklore of vampires and the paranormal, giving the vampires' bite and their venom wondrous and sensuous properties, mixing healing and life-giving properties with enslavement and extreme dependency. Like the Greek Gods, Mr Luedke's vampires are much more than human, but at the same time very human, with their emotions, their weaknesses, their hatreds, their

needs...and their love.

From the first novel, where he becomes a vampire, Aaron has tried to maintain his own sense of self (despite owing loyalty to Michelle and being connected, first to her and now to Urvashi, and able to read other people's thoughts) and morality, and he's been challenged by powers that are difficult to master, relationships that keep changing, and more than anything, by his human emotions. He's still in love with Michelle, has a not fully-understood relationship with Urvashi (a fallen angel full of mystery and surprises), still mourns his wife Anastasia and to the mix is added Katia, one of the Russian wolves/allies sent by Urvashi. Would you be able to love somebody who smells of wet-dog? More to the point...Is it really love? Are any of the relationships in the book love? I guess that depends on your definition of love. I think although some of the relationships in the book are pretty alternative, dependent, predatory...they would still qualify as some kind of love.

I personally like the two new characters, Katia and Ivan and their loyalty to the pack. The clashes of personalities between vampires and wolves at the beginning of the novel make for some very humorous situations but things get more serious as the plot progresses and their mission to find Michael Jamison doesn't go quite according to plan.

If you're looking for thrilling action, passionate sex scenes (a word of warning, it's an adult novel), urban underbelly settings, gore, paranormal, vampires, werewolves...you'll find it all in the new novel of the Nightlife series. The writing is fast-paced; the plot is exciting and the characters well-drawn and very human. And as a bonus you might find yourself thinking about what is love, like I did. Maybe we'll get the answer in the next novel. I'm looking forward to Moscow. I hope you are ready for it. I think I am.

This is the fourth book in the Nightlife series but it can be read as a standalone. Dark and gritty filled with sex, blood and mayhem.

Opening Scene:

“Fifty quid for a blow, a hundred for a fuck, but for one-twenty I'll take it in the bum.”

The Review:

Michelle and Aaron are hunting for the vampire Michael Jamison, who had stolen Michelle's blood and left her for dead. After tracking him to London, they soon realize that they need help in finding him. Aaron's new master Urvashi calls in a favor from werewolves Ivan and Katya, not realizing that they have history with Michelle. Putting the past on hold they traipse through the gritty underbelly of London through seedy clubs and into the path mayhem. Finding Michael becomes more elusive and dangerous at every turn.

Notable Scene:

In her emotional turmoil, Katya's mental block slipped. Aaron dived in and caught a whole new perspective. In Katya's mind, he saw a wretched creature with matted blonde hair in a shredded white dress, covered in blood from head to toe, completely feral, a wild animal with fangs and claws bared, hissing like a viper, spitting venom. This monster, Michelle, could not be beaten. Over and over again they came at her, from different angles, hoping to catch her off guard and take her down. She was too strong, too fast, her insanity had given her such wicked strength and speed. Katya's brother Andrei was one of the best, most fierce of

hunters, but he didn't last more than a few seconds against Michelle. This screaming banshee sliced Andrei to bloody ribbons and snapped his neck.

A bare handed butcher.

Katya's vivid memory sent a chill down Aaron's spine and churned his gut. It was all so fuzzy in Michelle's mind. She barely remembered those days when she lost her mind, lost her way, and somehow found a way back to sanity. But to Katya, it was one of the most traumatic things she had ever witnessed. The emotional scar from Michelle's dance of death with Katya's wolf pack ran deep through Katya's psyche. It pained her to this day. And there was something ugly lurking beneath the surface of her renewed grief.

When I opened up the first Travis Luedke book, The Nightlife New York, back at the beginning of the year, I was blown away, he took a stereotype of a type of book I would never read and squashed it. Now, several books into the series later and all I keep asking is when does the next one come out? So naturally, I one-clicked my way to The Nightlife London a couple of days ago and I am so happy that I did. The only drawback to having this book and devouring it so quickly is that I want more. Yup... I was disappointed when I hit the end. I just get lost in Travis's work so easily and it is over for me far too quickly.

If you have not read previous books in The Nightlife Series, this review will contain a few spoilers (especially of The Nightlife Paris).

The Nightlife series has found its way to London and Michelle and Aaron are on the hunt for Michael Jamison, the man who stole Michelle's blood and left her for dead in Paris and ultimately breaking the connection shared by Michelle and Aaron. My biggest fear with the situation with Jamison was if Aaron and Michelle could make it through this without their connection to each other or would the severed tie be the downfall of this dynamic duo... and then there's Urvashi. Aaron is now tied to the fallen angel and Michelle hates it with a passion. Aaron is hers. Can Michelle learn to share him with Urvashi? Throw in two wolves who want to kill all vampires and now you have a mix that certainly will not end well. Can Michelle and Aaron work with Urvashi, Katya and Ivan to stop Jamison or will they all kill each other first?

What I love about this series of books is the characters and their interactions. I love that Michelle and Aaron are so in love with one another even though in this book, their connection has been lost. I love the weird and twisted threesome that was created when Urvashi was thrown into the mix. And now there are two more characters and one of them is bound to Aaron, reminding him of his love in Ana (The Nightlife Las Vegas). I love the chemistry between the characters and I love the interactions. They are smart, witty and sassy! Aaron's character really has a chance to shine in London with his smartass comments and his understanding of the situation they are all in.

Once again, I have to commend Travis Luedke on the language in the book, though I am thrown off a lot in books that use foreign languages in them, I never feel lost or confused when he throws in the languages into his writing. I find it really captivating and it adds so much to the story. I can almost hear Michelle cussing in French (surprisingly, the few words in French I don't need translation of) but the banter back and forth with the languages didn't leave me struggling at all. I loved the smart ass comments and the very serious love

snaps throughout the book.

The Thrill Ride Continues

Overall - 4 stars

Adrenaline abounds as expected in The Nightlife series. My favorite vampires are trying to clean up past mistakes, but only seem to get into more trouble.

Fantasy World - 3 stars

London gets shortchanged in this book. It feels real enough and there are no bungee cords, but I wanted more. In the first book New York itself was a character as was Paris in the third book. Only the barest glimpse of London is provided this time.

Tingle - 5 stars

M/F and M/F/F action. Gives new meaning to the phrase sexual healing. Whew!

Characters - 4 stars

The nature of Aaron and Michelle's relationship changes yet again. Urvashi is relegated mostly to the background. New interests are introduced, but mysteries about them remain.

Story - 4 stars

Feels too short, but not rushed. Good storyline and continues series well, but felt more like tapas than a full main course.

Summary

"The Nightlife London" by Travis Luedke is a worthy member of the The Nightlife series, and continues the non-stop adventures full of sex and violence. There are echoes of "Taken" and "An American Werewolf in London" as Aaron and Michelle try to track down their Parisian attacker by visiting London strip clubs. Their own relationship is evolving since Michelle's death broke their previous bond, and the introduction of Urvashi adds confusion/irritation/lust. This fourth book in the series poses more questions than it answers, and feels more like a set up for the fifth book. It's good, but is perhaps not quite complete on its own.

Not recommended as a stand alone read. At the very least you'll need to read "The Nightlife Paris" to make sense of the characters, although reading the entire series is much preferable. The \$4.99 price is a bit steep for 178 pages, but the rest of the books can be purchased for \$7.99 by buying the Omnibus edition. Only \$2 each for the other books is a good bargain.

I am going to recommend right now that if you have not been keeping up to date with the Nightlife series, turn around right now and come back when you catch up! It's no secret that I am a fan of this series, it's a little dark, very edgy and most of all fun.

Travis does a really great job with recapping the series so far. As anyone who reads my reviews knows that for me, this is where the wheels can some times come off the wagon in a series. I don't want to read book 3 a second time during book 4. All that is avoided in Travis's books, he slips a few gentle reminders into his story as they are needed. We get to ride along with Aaron and Michelle on their next adventure and I was a little bit worried that I might get tired of this couple but the plot is always kept fresh. Travis isn't afraid to mess with his characters either.

We see the dynamic really change in London with the bond between Aaron and Michelle being broken. He can leave, she has no real control over him, especially now that he is stronger then her anyway. He stays because he wants to, but this break in the bond also changes Michelle in a way we haven't really seen yet. Urvashi added to the relationship really throws a monkey wrench in their happily ever after. We also get to meet not only two new characters, but a new breed of supernatural. The wolves bring a dilemma on more the one front.

Aaron really grows in this story but not necessarily always for the better. There are moments when it is glaringly obvious that he is basically a child with no impulse control, or short sighted and selfish. He also leads with his heart, more often to his detriment and that's sweetly endearing. The contrast, for me at least, was really amusing especially when he is surrounded by older, more jaded supernatural creatures, not just Michelle.

The action is fast paced and clever. Once you start this book, you jump right in and basically don't start until the end. As always with Travis he gives you one book, but all the while slowly setting up the next book with out you even realizing. I'll tell you this, I'm still not a fan of Urvashi but I think I love to hate her. I can't wait to see what happens when we get to Russia now that we have all these interesting new developments. Bottom line, this is a great paranormal romance/erotica read and a great continuation of the series. So if you have been following along this is a must read for you.

Trouble continues to plague both Aaron and Michelle. These terrible two blow into London with their brand of crazy. This time, instead of trouble finding them, Aaron and Michelle are actively causing it. They are hunting down Mike Jamison who stole blood from Michelle to become one of the undead and broke Aaron and Michelle's special bond.

This is the first in the series I found amusing. From a character stand point, Aaron and Michelle are less annoying. They have a purpose which is to catch a rogue vampire who should never have been made. They partner up with a pair of Russian werewolves. The stereotypes of Albanian crime lords and Russian mafia type are not as heavy as the previous few books. There are a few repetitive phrases which did become old after a while. The constant comparison of "wet dog smell" to the werewolves was a bit tedious. It reminds me of Laurell K. Hamilton and her "sleeping in a puppy pile".

After a bit of discussion with the author, it appears these stories are supposed to be in excess and extreme play into stereotypes. If a reader were to view this series more as a campy comedy, it makes more sense. I see this series now as more of a tongue in cheek poking fun of the paranormal romance genre from a male author's perspective. It contains all the key elements many female readers go ga-ga over. The male vampire is hot young man with money. He's powerful with a long schlongs and he is amazing with sex. His woman is a French sex-bomb. Aaron is designed to be dark and mysterious too. His predator side may be used to induce panty wetting goodness for the ladies. It's all rather droll.

The story pace is pretty good. This one is smoother and more polished. The sex scenes are just the right amount with good spacing between each. The sex itself is glossed over and faded to black. "The Nightlife: London (Urban Fantasy Romance) (The Nightlife Series)" by Travis Luedke is an explicit and powerful tour de force through London's nightlife. Starting off with a sex scene in a strip club Luedke throws us in at the deep end.

Enigmatic Vampire Aaron however is in the club to get information, not to quench his thirst for blood. He and Michelle are after the man who stole Michelle's blood. The trail leads the two further through London's underground with plenty of action and great plotting.

The dynamics between the main characters are excellently set up. Highly sexed and bound by blood thirst, blood slavery, domination and addictive ties to each other Aaron's master Urvashi, Michelle and Aaron have a strange threesome going. The arrival of two Russian werewolves complicates their personal and business relationships further.

Masterfully written the dialogue has many puns and punchlines I would like to remember, the characters are excellently drawn and are seriously flesh and blood throughout.
