Right away, I was interested in this story as it is well written. The scenes were shocking in detail and the author handles the scenes perfectly. He describes them perfectly and the reader has no problem imagining the brutality of the scenes. I applaud the author for not going too far with the horror and gross aspect of these intense scenes. The highlight of this book is how the author writes and paints a picture. The problem with this short story is that it is two parts. The first part is all the murders done in Satan's name. Unholy Revelations is his first published book that I can see, which, for a debut short story is jammed packed with detail and action that gets the pages turning.
