There is also another yet-to-be-identified bounty hunter searching for Han Solo. Despite having seen Vader use the Force, Han still does not believe in it. This seems to reiterate his stubborn nature, but it also makes him seem too stupid to realize what he had seen. Luke does not feel that he is worthy enough to be a Jedi and ultimately decides to head to Tatooine to search for answers, which he will probably find in the form of the book in Kenobi's home.
