This is a very practical series for kids on how to deal with life situations, filled with family values, and good advice, based on understanding and cause -effect situations. These are important issues, and we have read these books to our children over and over again for about nine years now, and this forms the bulk of our formal home-teaching on morality. Although this is not a particularly Christian series, I can relate many of

these ideas to cause and effect verses in Proverbs, in how to relate to other people or to get the best outcome in work, school, or homelife. For example, stealing and lying will cause people not to trust you even when you need their trust, whereas being honest will cause people to trust you and give you more freedom or responsibility. Some of the books give the warnings that one of the outcomes of negative behavior is that other people may not want to be around you (being mean, complaining, being selfish, etc.) While this may be true, and a good warning for young children, sometimes I think it makes my kids not want to be around other kids, because no kids will act perfectly on all these issues. One thing that is not talked about is forgiveness or putting up with a mildly bad character trait in someone for the sake of friendship. Also, it's fair to say that with all our repetitive reading on these books, our kids do not act perfectly on all these issues, either. These books start the conversations and bring understanding, but there are other aspects of training, too - repeatedly being held accountable to high standards - and of course, the temperament and decisions of individual children in choosing to behave well or not. Another good reference I would recommend is "Creative Correction," either the group study or the stand-alone book.
