Geekfest meets BDSM in this kinky erotic romance. This is a sweet quirky and amusing romance. The reader is taken on a tour of science-fiction slash comic convention through the eyes of a horny couple discovering BDSM.

Lindsey is still heartbroken over an abrupt breakup with her boyfriend, Ben. She's not exactly sure why Ben dumped her, but she suspects it's because of her newfound interest in BDSM. Lindsey figures out the missing piece in her life when she starts reading a BDSM comic, Balls N' Chains.

This story is above all, cute and pretty dead on for how some couples find themselves speeding forward into the BDSM lifestyle. It's not uncommon for one in the pairing finding this desire and dragging a sometimes unwilling partner into this freaky depraved fun. Lindsey is the aggressor in this scenario. She's actually pretty typical to find nowadays. I'm constantly meeting dissatisfied females in a relationship they want to spice up. These females sometimes spring it upon their lover in graphic detail or they try through subtle hints. Lindsey chooses the later method and it blows up in her face. Ben thinks it's some kind of test and goes overboard in what he believe Lindsay wants to hear. This is a key point - the lack of open communication in this relationship is already a problem which BDSM will only exacerbate if not addressed immediately.

What Lindsey goes through in this story is not too different from what we call "sub frenzy". She's learned this new thing and she wants to try it all. She dives in hard with very little research other than a smexy comic book. This sets her up for disappointment because she wants to be a sub. She needs a Dom and Ben falls woefully short. Ben is immediately competing against a fictional Dom from a comic book no less. With dominating not being Ben's natural inclination, it's already intimidating to try and meet up to Lindsey's desires.

This entire scenario is appalling accurate and something I see time and time again. I feel badly for these newbie dominants completely out of depth and with little guidance. Unless the male is already confident, this could crush them. Ms. Dryden does a great job showing this very realistic scenario down to Ben's concerns of fumbling and tripping.

The BDSM scenes in this story are light and erotic. There are more toys involved then actual D/s scenes going on. Even though there is constant mention of a dominant demeanor exhibited by several males in this story, I didn't feel it. There isn't a case of showing dominance. There is more kinky accoutrements to engage a BDSM feel. For a D/s situation to translate into actions in a story, isn't not easy.

The main characters Lindsey and Ben are sweet and consistent with those interested in science fiction and comic books. The supporting characters are interesting as I haven't read the first book. I'm now interested in reading the first one because Ivan intrigues me. He is what Sheldon from The Bing Bang Theory might be if he were to be a dominant.

The story is at times confusing because the point of view switches between Ben and Lindsey. I would recommend Ms. Dryden to stick to one point of view in each chapter. Several pieces of her dialog are quite memorable as she entwines it with geek-speak. My favourite from Ben -

"I always knew you were a pervert. I just needed to grow up enough to realize that was a feature, not a bug."

As far as the story goes, it was pretty entertaining. Ben, Lindsey and their fellow geekmates attend a convention in Phoenix, Arizona where Ben, after having caught on to what Lindsey Truly wants in a relationship, proceeds to show her he can be everything she needs. But Lindsey's not sure if he's just doing it for her, or if it's what he wants as well.

I thought Ben was really cute whenever attempting to bring out his inner Dom. There were plenty of laugh out loud moments, but I still felt as though he wasn't at his full GeekDomness. Truth be told, I didn't believe he was truly a Dom at all. To me he was more the loving bf who is willing to do anything, no matter how outrageous it might seem, just to please his woman. Ben realizes that to get Lyndsey he must become a Dominant to her submissive...

Throw in bit of this...

And a bit of that...

and you have The Seduction Hypothesis.

So my question is, can someone just "decide" to become a Dom? Even with some small tendencies, is that enough to build a D/s relationship? I don't think so. There were also a few other problems with this book. It was a bit confusing at first. I am not an unintelligent person but there were a few large words that my dictionary didn't even know. Really necessary? No. Things also skipped forward a bit fast. The back-story was dispersed throughout and it became a bit confusing.

I'll cut to the tl;dr chase: We need more books like this one.

I'm not saying that because this was Nobel Prize-contender literary fiction, but because **The Seduction Hypothesis** is what's missing from so much of the erotica coming out right now: smart, funny erotica written for smart women (and men as well).

When the story opens, Lindsey, our erstwhile heroine, is on her way to a con with a group of fellow smart people: grad students, comic book nerds, scientists... In other words, my kind of people. Lindsey is a big fan of *Ball and Chain*, a fictional graphic novel series with a BDSM theme. When she shared her interest in the

novels with her boyfriend, he balked, leading to their breakup. Of course, they'd already made plans to attend the con together, so there they are, heading to the con with the same group of friends, where Lindsey plans to cosplay her favorite character from the series.

While there, she meets the creators and is asked to fill in as her favorite character. And when ex-boyfriend Ben sees her in costume, well, he has to confront his own feelings about what Lindsey might have been asking and how he feels about it himself.

The Seduction Hypothesis is a quick, fun read, but most of all, it's exactly what I've been looking for. For starters, it skips over the trope that every Dom out there comes with his own Barbie Dreamhouse Dungeon all ready for the spanking. It acknowledges that people come to the world of BDSM at their own pace, and sometimes after balking at it at first. It shows more of the give and take necessary for a couple to really find their way with this type of relationship -- i.e., it's more than checking things off on a pre-printed checklist.

Best of all, the book features people who might really exist. Sure, Lindsey has a smoking body (as does Ben), but they are TOTAL DORKS. Ben stumbles his way through everything. They are at a con. Most of their conversations have to do with all manner of nerd-like things. I'm willing to bet that more people who read erotica can relate to these characters than the ultra-suave mega-rich characters currently overpopulating the genre.

Give me a nerd in cosplay attire any day of the week. And more in this series, please.

Dear Ms. Dryden:

The Seduction Hypothesis is the sweetest book I've ever read involving stainless steel butt plugs and a spreader bar with a set of neoprene ankle cuffs. The hero Ben is just adorable. A few months ago he stupidly broke up with his now ex-girlfriend Lindsay because he'd panicked, an act he's regretted since the moment he did it. Now, the two are on their way to BeastCon—sort of nerd convention for fans of comics/games/anime—and Ben is going to use the next five days to get her back.

It takes Ben just a few hours riding to Phoenix with Lindsey for him to realize she is turned on big time by the erotic graphic comic she's reading, *Balls 'n' Chain*. Ben knows just how she's feeling.

In the single issue he'd read, the girl called Sub Red had worn a shiny black sleeveless catsuit thing unzipped almost to her navel, with suicidally high-heeled boots. Halfway through the comic, the pants had been replaced with short shorts for some reason he couldn't recall.

He'd read that entire issue with a painful hard-on, put the comic aside and never touched another one for fear he'd explode. It was actually more potent than porn in its effect on him, but he felt horribly guilty for getting turned on by the stuff. He wasn't supposed to be aroused by the idea of hitting girls on the ass with whips. Or his hand. Or any of the rest. He couldn't understand why Lindsey, who seemed as progressively feminist as all the other girls of their circle, wanted to read something so misogynistic. True, there were as many women giving the beatings in *Balls 'n' Chain* as receiving them. But shouldn't that be beside the point? Even the Dominatrices were objectified into sex objects. Hell, everyone was objectivized into a sex object.

He'd told her as much, maybe even scolded her a little, the next time she'd tried to show him a panel from the comic.

Ben, who really is a total peach pie, is also very smart. (A grad student in history. Sigh.) As he thinks about himself and Lindsey, he begins to understand that the whole Master/Slave dynamic is just the thing he needs to, well, master, in order to be the guy Lindsey wants. In fact, not only does he want to be that guy for Lindsey, he wants to be that guy for himself. So, when they get to Phoenix, Ben embarks upon a well-thought out and very sexy totally in charge seduction of Lindsey. It's the nicest, hottest, campaign to get a girl out of her Slave Leia costume I've ever read.

The Seduction Hypothesis is a great book. It's funny, emotionally engaging, and full of fabulous dialogue. As Ben begins to begin to be Master Ben, he runs everything he's doing by Lindsey. This endeared him to me. It's not enough for Ben to realize what Lindsey wants, he's such a good guy, he talks her through why they weren't like this before, and how, now, it's all going to be different.

At the convention, Lindsey, who looks a lot like Sub Red, is recruited to stand-in for—actually, be tied up as—Sub Red at the *Balls 'n' Chain* booth. Ben finds her after she's done her first shift.

“Did that guy paddle your ass? Or spank you, or flog you, or any other variation of that?”

Lindsey shook her head against the tug of his fingers, her mouth suddenly too dry to speak. She was breathing too fast, practically panting. If Ben slid a hand between her legs right now she'd go off like a bottle rocket.

He seemed to give a lot of thought to what he said next, stating it slowly and clearly as though he wanted there to be no misunderstanding.

“I can't stop thinking about doing all that to you. Not just the spanking, either, a lot more. A lot. If anybody is going to do that stuff to you, I want it to be me. Nobody. Else.”

She was so accustomed to thinking of him as cute, as harmless. The kind of man who would never hurt a fly. Softly focused, with his sandy hair and indeterminate hazel eyes, vacillating about his career. She'd never seen this version of him until last night's assertive kiss, this razor-sharp Ben who knew what he wanted and seemed potentially ruthless about getting it.

But still. “Just because you think that's what I wanted you to do before?” The music shifted gears, growing louder, and the bass drum throbbed through her bones in a maddening primal beat.

I loved everything about this book. The secondary characters—Ben and Lindsey get helpful tips from Ivan and Cami, the couple from the first book in Ms. Dryden's *The Science of Temptation* series, **The Theory of Attraction**—are effectively rendered and add humor and nuance to the novel. The convention is described in fascinating detail and gives the story an ideal context. Ms. Dryden's writing is wonderful; she shifts easily back and forth from Ben's and Lindsey's perspectives, giving each a clear and interesting voice.

For me, this book was a perfect romance read. **The Seduction Hypothesis** is a kinder, sweeter book than its predecessor, **The Theory of Attraction**. This novel has lots of hot, kinky sex in it but is first and foremost a love story. The BDSM in it is just one part of the lovely relationship between Ben and Lindsey. The two use their altered sexual dynamic to improve their already strong bond. As Ben tells Lindsey, "I always knew you were a pervert. I really, really enjoy the books in this series. I reviewed the first book last year (you can find my A rated review of it [HERE](#)). This is the second book in the series. They absolutely work as stand-alones although you get to see quite a bit of the couple from the first book in this one and it's fun to see how their relationship has progressed. What I love about these books is that the characters in them are so unlikely.

In this book we have Ben and Lindsey. They dated and were really serious, until Ben saw how Lindsey reacted to Ivan. Ben never thought he was good enough for Lindsey and has some self-esteem issues when it comes to their relationship so he broke up with her. They are both struggling with that decision, but before they broke up, the entire group of friends decided to take an RV on a 19 hour drive from Houston to Phoenix for a comic-con. At this point, they've both invested the money and don't want to back out even though it's bound to be really awkward and uncomfortable.

Through events at the comic con and drive there, the couple from book #1 realize that Lindsey is really curious about BDSM and more than likely a sub. They recognize the struggle between Lindsey and Ben, so they put a bug in his ear about what really may be the issue between the two of them.

I really enjoyed this because Ben is a normal guy. He sooo doesn't want to admit how much the BDSM aspect turns him on because he feels like that isn't right and politically incorrect. No girl wants a guy to admit that he likes subjecting them, so he denies it and that precipitated his break-up with Lindsey. She feels

like he's condemning her because that's what she really wants, but can't find the courage to actually tell him that. But as he begins to explore this world, he finds his inner Dom and it was fun to see him become more aggressive and self-confident through that. Ben had a great transformation through this book.

Lindsey is a little bit more difficult. She's finally decided what she wants in her sexual life. I loved the visuals of her as Sub Red, one of the comic book characters that she dresses up as. She could have saved both her and Ben so much trouble if she'd just been honest with him, but I can understand her reluctance/shyness. I also understand her concerns that Ben may just be playing with the idea. She's been hurt by him and it's so hard for her to trust him again.

Like I said, this book and series is just pure smexy fun. The entire book this time takes place at the comic con...and I loved the nerdiness of it all in contrast to these guys who truly are big, bad Doms.
