Kia is an alien from the planet Nerak. She goes on a mission to retrieve her cousin Mala from Earth. She crashes her spaceship in a tree. With her DNA finder broken how is she going to find her cousin? Within her first few hours on Earth Kia lands herself in the middle of a fight in a seedy trucker bar and is rescued by a hunky cop, Nick. Nick has a nose for trouble and it seems it always finds him. Now, he has a woman he can't shake who claims she is from another planet.

Earth Guys are Easy is a light-hearted, futuristic romp. I felt that the beginning of the story was weak. Kia and Nick jump right into bed after they meet and it felt forced and false. There also is some mental lusting in the story that didn't really interest me and weakened the romance. But once the story focused on Kia's discovery of Earth and its differences from her planet, the story picks up.

My favorite parts of this book were Kia's immersion into Earth's culture. She is unfamiliar with food, clothing, money and how babies are made. Kia's discoveries were fun to read. Kia's planet is a lot different from Earth; the most notable is that only women make up the population. First thing on Kia's mind is testing out a real man because on Nerak there are only robots. Kia is a bit of a cliché, but it works in this story because it's just a fun, campy read. If you pick this one up, don't expect anything heavy.

Enjoyable read - it is both light and charming and filled with silly and amusing characters. I guess you could call it a futuristic - heroine is an alien on contemporary Earth looking for her cousin. Our hero spends a lot of time not believing that - despite a 'phaser' that makes people disappear for 20 minutes and return without their clothes. Since he's a cop on suspension [initially for rescuing our heroine in a biker bar, and later because Internal Affairs thinks he's in bed with the Russian Mafiya:] he spends his time helping to find her cousin. Endless misadventures and misunderstandings ensue - mostly on the part of a moll who decides that our hero and heroine are smugglers. When they do find out where the cousin is they set off to meet with her - pursued by the moll and her boyfriend Slava whose uncle IS Russian mafiya, the harpy with an agenda from Internal Affairs, and Weldon the computer geek who they showed the phaser to. Must have made quite a

I'd been looking forward to Kia's story since I finished the first Planet Nerak book, Close Encounters of the Sexy Kind. While I chuckled at Kia's introduction to Planet Earth and found Nick sexy, I think Mala's and Mason's romance from the first book resonated more with me.

I could have done with a bit more development with Nick's character and some follow-through on those Nerak gems that Kia had - especially when Nick isn't a category-type billionaire hero. On the contrary, he appeared to me to be scraping together a living as a cop. He's hoping to save enough money to open a bar and become a beach bum if he can find someone to look after the bar. Other than that, he has no other ambition and is a slob - his apartment is littered with dirty clothes and the sink is full of unwashed dishes...on second thoughts, maybe Nick isn't all that sexy because if there was an epilogue, I fear Kia would be left manning the bar, washing Nick's dishes and laundry while he surfs and fishes all day, everyday.

Anyway, while Nick may not come off better when compared to Mason, the sheriff-hero from Book 1, Cosmic Sex was a fast and enjoyable-enough read. If Karen Kelley does write a third Planet Nerak book, however, I don't think I'll buy it unless I know someone who has read Book 1 and 2 and still recommends it. This is because I don't think the new-alien-on-the-block plot device can stretch to 3 books. Already, in Book 2, there's the inevitable repetition of Kia talking openly in public about wanting sex from Nick. Scenes like

that are funny the first time, can still raise a chuckle the second but the third time? Nah.

I would also have liked to see more of Mala and Mason as well as Barton and Carol from the first book but they didn't appear until near the end. Cosmic Sex wasn't a big disappointment but I did expect a little better.

Kia crash-lands on Earth while searching for her cousin Mala, who left their home planet Nerak several months ago to look for a new life. She doesn't find Mala right away (her DNA-based GPS is damaged in the crash), but she does find Nick Scericino – an honorable and sexy undercover cop. He starts a bar room brawl to defend her honor and takes her home with him where they unleash their passions on one another in one steamy scene after another. Nick doesn't immediately believe that Kia's an alien, but she has a few tricks up her sleeve that eventually convince him otherwise. Once he does believe, he commits to helping her find Mala. As their feelings for one another grow stronger, Nick and Kia realize it's going to be awfully hard for both of them when Kia has to return to Nerak. An amusing side-plot involving the Russian mafia and a misunderstanding has a whole host of characters trailing after Nick and Kia as they search for Mala. Once they find her, Kia will have to choose – Earth and Nick or Nerak and her previous life.

Kia's unfamiliarity with Earth's customs gets her into lots of trouble – with entertaining consequences. She's also extremely bold – knows how to ask for and gets what she wants (lots of bedroom romps with Nick). It's nice to read a strong female character who doesn't constantly doubt herself (ok, strong female alien). Nerak isn't all that well-developed – it's not clear if Kia's human or if she's just humanoid, and all we really know is that the male of the species was eliminated many years ago because of their tendencies toward violence (i.e. ALL GIRL PLANET!!1). So, yeah, a bit cheesy, but Karen Kelley makes it fun, so it works. I'm a little embarrassed to be seen carrying around a book called *Cosmic Sex*, but I'll get over it. If you like a light, sexy read (with aliens), be sure to check this one out.
