The bar in question is a biker bar where she meets Danny who is a member of the Ghosts of the Prairie MC and with nothing else to lose she decides to have some fun with an incredibly hot man.

So what went wrong?

There wasn't much story and the fact that I really liked Danny the hot Native American biker wasn't enough to save this book.

This wasn't so much an MC as a group of friends that ride together, we don't know where they get their money or if they have a president, Danny is referred to as Captain but that's it there's none of the usual biker hierarchy.

I was left with a lot of questions particularly what's Cady's problem and while I appreciate this is a first in series since her problem seemed to be with Danny and Penny I assumed we'd get an answer here.

I wasn't too keen on the writing, it didn't flow, the dialogue seemed stilted and it felt more like a draft at times and ultimately I was left with the feeling that I'd wasted my time.

I found the recession and the towns left behind interesting and again I would have liked more on this.

It's a short book at only 88 pages and the majority of it is taken up with sex, not a bad thing you might be saying but....

The sex isn't good it's spoiled by things like this:

'opening to the meaty flesh'

'the meaty clitoris'

'meaty pearl'

Is it just me or is this just strange?

Also as far as I can tell they have unprotected sex within a couple of hours of meeting each other but the worse part was when they had what I'm assuming was unprotected sex (since there's no mention of condoms anywhere) in the hotel's swimming pool, just gross.

I skimmed large chunks of this particularly the sex scenes so it turned out to be an incredibly quick read.

With that being said, this was somewhat interesting except it needed more development. I felt the dialogue between the characters was stilted at best, to properly spoken at worst. I know just because they're bikers, they don't need to speak or sound stupid, but what biker speaks proper English? It felt fake. It felt like the author thought it'd be okay to just add a pain in the ass female lead, a hot a shit Native American male lead, throw around a few MC words, add like 20 different sex scenes in a 80 page book and boom you have yourself a story! Sadly no...all she ended up getting was just a pain in the ass female lead who for some reason didn't know how to stand up for herself at the ripe old age of 28 and has unprotected sex with a damn stranger like an hour after meeting him and continues to do so for the remainder of the story. Granted Danny is cute as a button but really both him and Penny are nasty as hell! Come on...unprotected sex! An hour after meeting each other for what you thought was a one night stand! That's fucking nasty!

Outside of that, the story did have some potential that should have been explored furthered, the recession and subsequently 'almost' ghost towns, the bad guy in the story Wayland, unfortunately his time was very limited which sucked because he seemed like a great 'bad guy'..lol. Even the rivalry between both clubs should have been explored furthered as we don't even find out until the very end why they even disliked each other. This book just needs soooo much help.

There actually could be something here if either - someone who knows how to be a writer became involved, or an editor were used.

Characters are semi well developed, semi-consistent in personality... but the author couldn't be bothered to give them regular names. One of the main characters literally has name changes throughout the story - it's horrible. If the author couldn't even be bothered to give her character one consistent name, and/or edit the book even a little bit to be sure her own characters' names were consistent, then I'm not sure why anyone should spend their time reading it.

That said, I became intrigued and it's a really shallow, quick read so I did read it.

There is ... sort of a plot. If that makes sense. There are biker gangs, and rivals but... much of the rivalry seems just that: an unfounded rivalry, that feeds stereotypes. This could be developed into something a bit

deeper, more complex though, and make for a fun book.

The sex scenes are a joke.

I would NEVER discourage anyone from writing or ANY of the arts. This author should certainly keep trying... but I do think she should NEVER attempt sex again. While I realize there's something for everyone / everyone for something... I've not been able to find ANYone who can wrap their head around phrases like "meaty bits" and "alternate entrance".

At times, I was confused as to whether the sex scenes were supposed to be serious? They almost read more like satire. When a clitoris is not even once, but routinely, consistently referred to as "meaty bits" and the like (imagine: other meat analogies that I'd much prefer to forget), it's impossible to take the scene seriously.

Of course if you're looking for something to mock, and aren't easily traumatized, perhaps give this a look. Fair warning: I traumatized everyone I told about the author's analogies for human anatomy, so do not come at this with a weak stomach.
