Saige has to know about what happened to her 8 years ago and starts the ball rolling on getting people to look into what really happened. On her side helping are Quinten's brother and a Detective who was part of the original case.

Quinten and Saige were in love all those years ago and even though she had forgotten, its all now coming back and she is going to do whatever it takes to get her man off of death row.

As Saige and the Detective start pulling strings what they unravel is shocking. And even once the unraveling is all done the author throws the biggest shocking twist at the end that you dont see coming.

So where do I start?

First, this wasn't what I've expected it to be. I thought it would be a love story. Heroine decides to visit Hero because she remembers something/wants to know something. Then they meet. For the first time. And then they try to get him out of this prison, because he's innocent. They fall in love. HEA. I envisioned this kind of story.

But that's not what I've got. This book begins exactly 28 days before the hero is supposed to be executed. And the chapters are divided by the hours of the days. The heroine wants to find out about what happened to her. Exactly 28 days before. And why? Because she saw the picture of her "captor" and didn't feel any "bad vibes". Rolling my eyes here. WTH? This is so ridiculous. I would have hated to have lost 2 years of my memory. I would've done anything to uncover it, and live my life and not hiding out somewhere where no one knows me.

Then she meets Alex, the hero's brother, and together they want to uncover the truth. It seems juvenile. But whatever.

Too many POV: nearly everyone in this book gets a POV. The heroine, the hero, Alex, the attorney, the detective and so on. It's just too many. I don't care about all these people. And there are quite a bit of sub stories involved. The detective and his co-worker. Then Alex and his relationship with the step-mom of the heroine. While reading, I felt like walking through molasses. I just didn't get anywhere. At all!

I stopped at 50%. I was nowhere in the story!! There were so many things happening. Creepy guys, letter writing, car bomb, dead bodies, suspicions. But I didn't get to know the hero or his relationship to the heroine. Nothing! This is no romance, it's a suspense, or a crime themed book.

Then there was Alex. OMG. Manwhore. He slept with everyone in this book. Well I think except for the heroine, but that's just because his brother called dibs. He slept with the step-mom of the heroine. She's married at that time. But no problem here! Then he slept with a girl in town, on an off in his teens. She was his to-go girl, when nobody else was available. Then he comes to town with the heroine, after 8 years, runs into said girl (now woman) and what does he do? Looking forward to "visit" her. Gross! And then he slept on and off with a woman who worked for his attorney, just so he could get inside info. Hmm, I don't get it, I mean the attorney worked for him, so how doesn't he get the info? The last time the woman visited him at his home, he didn't want to sleep with her. But then she told him she had info, and then he was like: "Oh alright, well then, let's do this."

Hero: I don't like him. He was married. To a "crazy" woman, according to him. Why did he marry her? And why not leave her? Was he afraid? Hmm? I just don't get it? The wife slept around on him, and he did NOTHING at ALL! Such a coward. And then he sees the heroine for the first time and then poof, he's in love. But he doesn't leave his wife! No why should he? He's just flirting around a little. But then he can't keep his hands to himself any longer and he sleeps with the heroine. While married to his wife. Gross Nr. 2. But that's not all.
