It's the same with the dialog it seems like the characters spend most of the book rehashing the same things when they talk. You'd think it would be frustrating for the characters, having the same conversation a dozen times. It was certainly frustrating to read. I'm not stupid I don't need to hear something five times before I understand it, but this author seems to like to beat you over the head with everything.
