I have to say it took me a bit to get into this one. I have a really hard time buying the “love at first sight” concept, so I was a bit turned off by the first few chapters of the book. I’ve also been in a six month long reading rut. But, since I went through this with Marigny Street as well, I made myself keep going because I knew Welch’s writing would make it worth reading once I got to the heart of the story.

And it did!

I didn’t exactly fall in love with the romance, because like Marigny Street, it was just a bit too heavy for my tastes. And that’s what it boils down to really—my taste. I prefer the romance to take a backburner and be slow building, but this series just isn’t that kind of story. And that’s okay. About a quarter of the way into the book I decided to take it for what it really was, and I was able to really enjoy it that way.

Welch’s writing really has a way of drawing you in and making you feel like you’re right in the middle of this big group of beautifully dysfunctional people. I loved this cast, and I think the secondary characters add a lot to the story. Any time the romance would get to be too much for me, the rest of the characters would come in and lighten it up. Welch does a great job of crafting her characters.

I liked that Red Dirt Road wasn’t your “boy meets girl, boy saves girl” kind of story. They both have their demons (in more ways than one...) and they work through them together, leaning on each other, rather than it being one sided.

This is the 2nd book in the Saving Angels series; however, it does not leave off where Marigny Street leaves off. In the 1st book, there really isn't closure. I thought that in this book, Red Dirt Road, we would continue the story of Evangeline and Gabriel, but we don't. We are introduced to a new set of main characters,

Michael and Layla, and a whole group of supporting characters. It is a brand new story. While Eva and Gabriel are mentioned in passing, we don't really learn anything new about them. At first, I was disappointed. I wanted to know how they turned out; but, as the story went along, I came to REALLY like Michael and Layla's story a lot more.

Layla, Lotus as she is also called, believes the universe is out to get her, but is confusing those she loves for her and killing them instead. She has lost her mother, father, husband, and unborn child, and has built up a wall around her heart as a result. She tries not to let anyone new in. She goes on tour around the country with her uncle, Willie, and his band. At their last stop, they decide to do ProMature night, where they choose someone out of the crowd to sing with someone from the group. It is during Layla's turn that she meets Michael. They have an instant pull towards one another. After their song, Michael and his friends, Seamus and Andrew, hang out with the group for a bit.

After they go their separate ways, fate seems to step in at 7-11. As Layla is buying some late night snacks, there is a robbery in progress and Michael saves her life. They rest they say is history...Willie offers Michael and gang a place to stay and jobs at his bar and hotel. However, there is rising tension in the group between Michael and one of the band members, Yuma. He is suddenly showering Layla with attention and it seems he is not going without a fight. He tries to put a wedge between the two, as if Layla isn't doing the job herself already. Yuma is creepy and everyone gets really bad vibes from him. He seems to follow her around and cause destruction wherever he goes. Where Michael is good and light, Yuma is evil and dark.

This book mainly focuses on struggles, Layla and Michael's struggles individually, and their struggles to come together and stay together as a couple. Layla has to learn to let the walls down. She struggles with loss and misplaced guilt. She really believes she is the cause of death. She has to find her purpose in life and make the choice to start living life. Michael believes his purpose to life is fighting. He is a boxer, and a good one at that. He has to choose to keep his life on the same path or forge a new one.

I really enjoyed the supporting characters as well. My favorite was Madam Catalina. She is a blind woman with a gift of sensing and reading people. Lotus is stronger than we realize. We know she is beautiful, captivating, and most of all she is funny. Up against an evil that is so strong, it will be through her that she will have to fight the biggest fight for her life and for the love of her life, Michael.

The sexual tension between Lotus and Michael is constant. I craved them, without all the dirty words and sex scenes, it really wasn't needed. See, this story is like a piece of art. It is there for us to interpret, to put together, to relate to it, to feel from it, and to appreciate it. The Second in the Saving Angels series by Annie Rose Welch, this story is different from the first: new characters, new storyline, and it isn't until you are immersed in the story, far into the lives of Layla and Michael that the connections are revealed.

Layla (also called Lotus) is hiding from the world, just existing after the death of her first love and husband: in fact everyone she loves has died far before she was ready to let them go. Deciding that her love is dangerous, she refuses to engage with anyone: a lonely life even though her friends and remaining family are constantly hoping to engage her in life.

When a mysterious man saves her from a random shooting, the sparks between them are palpable, even as

they both fight the attraction and their destiny. Michael is Irish, a singer and piano player and soon the two are battling their attraction as they seek a way to be together.

Again Welch has created a story that drops the reader into the world she has created, providing characters that have distinct and understandable flaws that they often parade out for show. While the connection to the first story and to the Angelic saviors is longer in coming, the story builds the world and offers multiple options for solution to readers trying to sort the multiple mysteries: none of which are truly solved until the last page turns. Details are beautifully drawn, the prose is lovely, and conversations are solidly crafted with a natural feel that helps to bring characters and story to life.

There are more stories in this series to come that will bring answers yet unsolved for readers, with her unique characters, intertwined threads of intervention and redemption and the beautifully descriptive writing style help this series stand out as a lovely meander through the south: quietly claiming a place in your heart.

Wow! This is an amazing book by a brand new author. This is the second in her Saving Angels series, the first being Marigny Street. I can see her growth as an author from book one to book two and I see many more wonderful stories in her future. This author is also a wonderful person. While reading this book I had questions so I contacted her via Facebook and she was more than willing to discuss both books with me.

First off this book is the age old story of good versus evil. These two forces are fighting for Layla's very being. She so badly wants to succumb to the good, the pure, the angel Michael but the pure evil, the devil here on earth keeps her fears of being a death magnet alive. Layla must learn to fight for herself and choose the life she wants.

The banter between Layla and Michael is hysterical. The first real conversation between the two starts with Layla telling Michael, "If you want to get out of this alive, you might want to go and sit with the oodles of noodles." And Michael replying, "Have you lost your bloody mind?" A few lines later "I'm aiming for heaven, but I'm going to wind up in hell dealing with you." This may not seem like much out of context, but trust me when you get to this point in the story, you'll be rolling with laughter.

Not too long ago I told you about the first book Annie Rose Welch's *Saving Angels* series, *Marigny Street*. It remains one book that even today, weeks later, lives still in my thoughts and heart. I truly believe it's simply one of those stories that stick with you. Not just because of what happened in the story, or to the characters; more, it is the emotion that it produced within me, and the varied paths my thoughts have taken because of it.

However, *Marigny Street* is merely the first book in a series of what I'm coming to expect as books that will continue to emotionally knock me to my knees. *Red Dirt Road* tells a different story than its predecessor but the love that shines between its main characters, Michael and Layla is every bit as brilliant as that which we read about between Gabriel and Eva. Though the struggles they face are different (while aspects may carry some similarities), and the emotional barriers Michael and Layla have to cross have different sources, *Red Dirt Road* touched in me in much the same way that the first book in the series did.

Layla has lost nearly everything she has ever loved and is, in quite a number of ways, hanging on by her fingernails - to life, to sanity and to some semblance of happiness. Her life has become something she never really intended for it to be but she has structured it that way to keep herself, and everyone around her, safe. But safety is sometimes a precept, like beauty, that can only be seen by the beholder. To others the safety Layla created for herself merely looked like a recipe for unending loneliness.

In his dreams Michael has been fighting to find, save and hold one thing all his life. Each night in his sleep he battles to seize the thing that will finally make him whole. But during his waking hours Michael has been fighting one battle after another as well - in the boxing ring, making a name and unquestionable reputation for himself. Yet he's not just a determined warrior, he's also a poet and a lover, a musician, and a man with an impeccable set of morals, quick wit and wicked humor. When he sees Layla, he knows she's the one thing he has been waiting, searching and fighting for for so long. And he knows that he'll spend the rest of his life fighting for her too.

Now to convince her that not only is she worthy of the fight, but that she's strong enough to battle beside him as well - secure in the knowledge that if she should falter, he will always be there for her, just as he trusts that she would always support him when or if he needed help.

It's hard to explain exactly what makes me love these characters, or the menagerie of supporting characters that surrounds them. There's no one thing that makes me love the story, nor any single specific aspect that has me (already) anticipating the next book in the series.
