Cade owns the ranch where Abby's sister works and is considerably older than Abby but he has feelings for her that he couldn't express when she was younger. This is a great story of two people who need to communicate a lot better and be honest about what they really want.

Lionharted is the story of the last Hart brother, Leo, and Janie Brewster, a neighbor who has had a crush on him for years. When a manipulative friend of Janie's succeeds in driving them even further apart, Leo discovers that he hasn't really known how he felt. He has some serious making up to do if it isn't already too late.

Both of these stories are classic Palmer with an experienced older guy who tries to keep his hands off the younger virginal woman. The stories may show their age a little but they are still pure perfection to read if you love to see "the little woman" make that big hunk of Texas manhood fall like a big old tree.
